"Thou hearest the sound thereof, "but canst not tell whence it cometh, "and whither it goeth: "So is everyone that is born of the Spirit. The prime minister, Macmillan, nearly a year ago, spoke about the winds of change blowing through Africa. He was using a vivid phrase for a very obvious fact, (indistinct) it startled many political and religious conservatives who still do not want to recognize any kind of change. Just last Sunday, in the "New York Times Magazine" section, the article by Arnold Toynbee concluded with this sentence: "Today, the wind of Liberty "is blowing not only through Africa "but through all the world." It has been my privilege to spend the past year in India and the past three months traveling through Southeast Asia after nine years away from that part of the world. This morning, I want to attempt to bring you, very briefly and superficially, a weather report on the history, on the winds of change that are so obvious on that side of the globe. I told the chaplain I would not try to interpret the visions of Zechariah, which were read for the scripture lesson this morning. But those of you who wish to identify the red horses, or the black horses, or the white horses and the gray horses are welcome to do so, for as the angel told Zechariah, "These are the four winds of heaven, "who go forth to patrol the earth." The physical evidences of winds of charge are conspicuous on every side. A few years ago, there was scarcely one building in Hong Kong taller than five stories. And yet today, that picturesque harbor is surrounded by skyscrapers, from luxurious hotels and office buildings to teeming tenements. Of the million or more refugees in Hong Kong, one-tenth of them are being housed in overcrowded government apartment houses. On the outskirts of Malaya's new capital of Kuala Lumpur, a brand new city called Petaling Jaya has sprung up within the last two years out of the virgin jungle of Malaya, with thousands of homes, a magnificent, multicolored, modernistic university.
